# GUIDE TO CALLING







## WHEN TO CALL 911

- You should call 911 in any emergency that requires immediate assistance from the police, fire department, or
- ambulance.

STEP1



This will help with collecting your thoughts to provide info. to the dispatcher.



# REATHE



#### Know the Location

This will allow the dispatcher to help you faster.



**Dial 911** 

Use the nearest phone. Call 911 **before anyone else.** This will get you help sooner.

# IN CASE OF A FIRE

# Get to a safe place, then call.


Exit the house or building and use the nearest phone to dial 911.

If you have a **house** phone: pick up the phone and once you hear the dial tone, dial 911

#### If you have a **cell** phone: Make sure it is on and dial 911.



# WHEN TO TEXT 911

If you have a **hearing** or speech impediment, or are in a scenario where talking isn't safe/possible, text 911.

If you have a **cell phone**: Go to messages and type in 911 and then write your message.

# WHAT'S NEXT?



Wait for the phone to ring and a dispatcher will answer the call. Stay calm and answers all questions.

# WHEN TALKING TO THE DISPATCHER.

- Do **not** hang up the phone unless the dispatcher says to.
- If you are **unable to speak**: leave the phone off the hook or text if you have a cell phone. It allows the dispatcher to hear what's happening.





### WHAT SHOULD DO NEXT?

- The dispatcher will send emergency services, but continue to answer additional questions. This will not cause a delay.
- If it's a *medical emergency*: follow the dispatcher's instructions, put pets away, unlock the door, and turn on the porch light, and get medications.
- If there's a **fire**: get out of the house and to a safe place.





#### REVIEW OF STEPS

- 1. Dial 911 on your phone and **stay calm.**
- 2. Give the dispatcher the **exact location** and
  - phone number.
- 3. Remain on the line.
- 4. Never hang up first unless instructed to by the
  - dispatcher.



#### INFORMATION TO NOTE:

If you need to dial "9" or another number to reach an outside line, dial that number first, and then dial 911.



## WHAT TO DO WHILE WATING

If the patient has fallen: do not move he/she unless they are in danger of further injury.

If the patient is bleeding: apply pressure to the area with a clean dressing (towel, handkerchief, etc.

If the patient is having trouble breathing or chest pain: get them into a comfortable position and keep them calm. Get the patient's medical info. ready: include allergies, medications, insurance and personal information.



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
